

COOKIE POLICY

The Adoption Authority of Ireland uses "cookies" to help improve your browsing experience of our website. This Cookie Policy should be read in conjunction with our **Privacy Notice**

WHAT IS A COOKIE?

A 'cookie' is a small data file that is placed on your computer or mobile device ("device"). It allows a website to remember your actions or preferences until the cookie is deleted or expires. Some of the cookies we use are essential for our website to work. We also use some non-essential cookies to collect information to help us improve the website.

Cookies can be stored for varying lengths of time on your browser or device. Session cookies are generally deleted from your computer or device when you close your browser. Persistent cookies will remain stored on your computer or device until deleted or until they reach their expiry date as detailed in the tables below.

TYPES OF COOKIES USED

We have set out below the cookies we use, their purpose, duration and whether the cookie is placed by us or a third party. Some cookies are referred to as first party cookies meaning they are set by our domain. Third party cookies are set by a domain other than our website. Third party cookies are covered by the third parties' cookie policies.

Strictly Necessary Cookies

These cookies are necessary for the website to function and cannot be switched off in our systems. They are usually only set in response to actions made by you which amount to a request for services, such as setting your privacy preferences, logging in or filling in forms. You can set your browser to block or alert you about these cookies, but some parts of the site will not then work. These cookies do not store any personally identifiable information.

OptanonAlertBoxClosed	Third Party	This cookie is set by websites using certain versions of the cookie law compliance solution from OneTrust. It is set after visitors have seen a cookie information notice and in some cases only when they actively close the notice down. It enables the website not to show the message more than once to a user. The cookie has a one year lifespan and contains no personal information.	730 Days
OptanonConsent	Third Party	This cookie is set by the cookie compliance solution from OneTrust. It stores information about the categories of cookies the site uses and whether visitors have given or withdrawn consent for the use of each category. This enables site owners to prevent cookies in each category from being set in the users browser, when consent is not given. The cookie has a normal lifespan of one year, so that returning visitors to the site will have their preferences remembered. It contains no information that can identify the site visitor.	730 Days

Performance/Analytics Cookies

These cookies allow us to count visits and traffic sources so we can measure and improve the performance of our site. They help us to know which pages are the most and least popular and see how visitors move around the site. All information these cookies collect is aggregated and therefore anonymous. If you do not allow these cookies we will not know when you have visited our site, and will not be able to monitor its performance.
